John Wesley's Covenant Service*:

Collect: God, you have appointed our Lord Jesus Christ as Mediator of a new covenant; give us grace to draw near with fullness of faith and to join ourselves in a perpetual covenant with you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Covenant:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, by his death and resurrection has made a new covenant with all who trust in him.

On the one side, God promises in this covenant to bring us new life in Christ.

On the other side, we are pledged to live not for ourselves but for God.

From time to time we renew our covenant with God, especially when we reaffirm the Baptismal Covenant and gather at the Lord's table.

Today, therefore, we meet, as the generations before us have met, to renew the covenant that binds us to God.

The invitation: Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants.

Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him.

Christ has many services to be done. Some are more easy and honorable, others are more difficult and disgraceful.

Some are suitable to our inclinations and interest,

others are contrary to both.

In some we may please Christ and please ourselves. But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves.

Be satisfied that Christ shall give you your place and work.
