especially when we reaffirm the Baptismal Covenant and gather at the Lord's table.

Today, therefore, we meet, as the generations before us have met,

The Invitation: Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants.

Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him.

others are contrary to both.

In some we may please Christ and please ourselves.

But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves.
